

Afghan Migrants Rescued in Turkey, Greece Waters

KABUL - Afghan refugees rescued in the Aegean Sea on Saturday between Turkey and Greece, the Portuguese police said.

The Portuguese Maritime Police have rescued 33 migrants from a dinghy in the Aegean Sea on Saturday between Turkey and Greece. According to the police, there were nine children, nine women - including a pregnant woman and 15 men in the dinghy all from Afghanistan and the Democratic Republic of Congo.

The refugees were taken to the Skala Skaminis port on the Greek island of Lesbos. "Stop the boat, we are going to help you, Maritime Portuguese Police, we're going to help you, stop the engine, stop the engine, we help you, we help you," Portuguese policemen told the refugees as they were about to be rescued. Nangarhar Police Seize Hundreds of Motorcycles

JALALABAD - Police have impounded hundreds of undocumented motorcycles in eastern Nangarhar province as part of a security campaign.

Police said the campaign was launched after an uptick in targeted killings in the province and so far 600 motorcycles had been confiscated and the campaign would continue.

Nangarhar police spokesman Hazrat Husain Mashriqwal told Pajhwok Afghan News on Saturday that the campaign to impound undocumented motorcycle was launched three weeks ago in order to control the target killings.

He said the decision to launch the campaign against undocumented motorcycles, vehicles and tint glasses was made at the provincial military council.

Mashriqwal said people had started preparing documents of their motorcycles and they handed over one motorcar and 10 motorcycles ... (More on P4)...(9)

According to the local officials in Jawzjan, the woman, az Nazia was arrested and has been taken to an unknown location after she was accused of having illicit sexual relations with a man.

Taliban Besiege Border Police Battalion in Paktika

SHARAN - Heavy clashes are underway as a border police battalion has been besieged by Taliban in the Gomal district of southeastern Paktika province, officials said on Sunday.

A credible police source, who wished to go unnamed, told Pajhwok Afghan News that militants had besieged a battalion of border forces in the district since Saturday.

He added clashes were underway between the border forces and the Taliban while reinforcements were yet to arrive in the area. The clashes caused casualties but exact figures could not be obtained so far.

However, Governor Ilyas Wahdat denied the border police battalion was under siege. He said a clearing operation was underway in the area.

"A large number of Taliban militants, including some Pakistani nationals, were killed in the operation and their bodies are still lying at the scene," he said.

Taliban confirmed clashes in Gomal. The group's spokesman, Zabiullah Mujahid, said the militants had besieged Afghan border police battalion in the district.

A large number of border security personnel were killed and the Taliban also closed Gomal highway, he said. He said two Taliban fighters were also killed and five others wounded in Gomal and Sar Rawza district. A clash in ... (More on P4)...(13)

Taliban Still Active in Suburbs of Kunduz City

KUNDUZ - Security officials on Sunday told TOLONews that the Taliban still have safe places in suburbs of Kunduz city and they present a continued threat to the security of the city.

According to the military officials, despite claiming Kunduz city as being secure, the Taliban has not been eradicated completely and that their presence outside of the city remains to threaten peoples' lives.

The security forces say military operations are ongoing and Taliban have been cleared of many villages, but the group is still active in areas on the outskirts of



the city. "Military operations are going well and the security forces have had advances and have cleared some villages of insurgents. The Taliban has suffered lots of casualties," said Mirwais, commander of Afghan

Public Protection force battalion in Kunduz.

ISIS Claims Several Taliban Insurgents Killed, Wounded in Ghor Clashes



KABUL - The Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) terrorist group's offshoot in Afghanistan, ISIS Khurasan, claims that several Taliban insurgents were killed or wounded during the clashes in northwestern Ghor province of Afghanistan. Calling the group's fighters as 'Apostates' the

terror group in a statement said the clashes between the two sides started last week and as a result several Taliban insurgents were killed or wounded. The statement by the terror group further adds that in the latest attack on Taliban insurgents in Shorkan area of the province resulted into the killing of at least four Taliban insurgents while three others were wounded.

According to ISIS loyalists, the Taliban insurgents had initially launched a coordinated attack on the fighters of the terror group which was repulsed by them. ... (More on P4)...(14)

Daesh Prisons Chief among 3 Killed in Airstrike

ASADABAD - Three Daesh militants, including the group's prison in-charge, have been killed in an airstrike by foreign forces in eastern Kunar province, officials said on Sunday.
