Earlier, the HRW in a report urged President Muhammad Ashraf Ghani to immediately direct Afghan forces to implement war rules during battles. "President Ghani should state clearly that abiding by the laws of war is a legal requirement, not a policy option," said Phe-lim Kine, HRW deputy Asia director. ...

Kabul Officials Visit Afghan-Pak Skirmish Scene

SHARANA - A government delegation from Kabul and provincial officials on Thursday visited the Angoor Ada area, the scene of a bloody skirmish between Afghan and Pakistan forces in the Shakin border town of southeastern Paktika province.

Tuesday night's clash erupted after Pakistani forces allegedly tried to construct a border gate in the area inside Afghanistan's territory during night time.

The clash left an Afghan border police officer, Najibullah, dead and another two wounded, while 10 Pakistani soldiers were said to be killed.

USAID's Location Data of Clinics Inaccurate: SIGAR

KABUL - The Special Inspector General for Afghanistan Reconstruction (SIGAR) John Sopko has accused USAID of providing inaccurate or incomplete data on the locations of 80 percent of the health clinics it is funding in Afghanistan.

In a letter to USAID, Sopko noted discrepancies in the geospatial coordinates provided by the development agency last year for 420 of 641 health care facilities in the country. An additional 90 of those clinics had no accompanying geographic coordinates.

The data, provided to Sopko's organization in May 2014, is based on geospatial coordi-



nates compiled by the Afghan Ministry of Public Health. While the data set was limited to ...

Fighting Continues in Jalrez as Taliban Seize Several Check Points

KABUL - Jalrez provincial council painted a bleak picture on Friday on the Wardak province situation when they announced that the Jalrez district has virtually fallen into the hands of the Taliban. Addressing a press

conference Friday morning, provincial council members said that armed insurgents have taken control of almost the entire district, with the exception of the district governor's building and some other government offices.

They said a number of police officers have been killed by the armed insurgents and heavy clashes are ongoing between security forces and the militants. One council member blamed the central ...

Helmand Conflict-Affected Families Demand Rights



LASHKARGAH - As many as 600 internally displaced families in southern Helmand province demanded their registration to get their due share of rights, an official said on Thursday.

Mohammad Nadar Watanwal, director labor and social affairs, told Pajhwok Afghan News the number of injured and disabled by the conflict had been increased during this year.

More than 440 disabled persons and 134 bereaved families had registered in last three months alone. The

number had increased since the lives of civilians had been completely neglected in the ongoing war, he said.

Hayatullah Mayar, secretary of Helmand provincial council, said the number of casualties were higher than mentioned by Watanwal. "These are only the names of the people hailing from the center where the war affected people of the districts did not have facilities to register," he added.

Kabul Police Arrest 234 in Anti-Crime Blitz

KABUL - Kabul police have arrested 234 people in the past two weeks in an anti-crime operation.

According to Kabul police chief Abdul Rahman Rahimi, 234 people were arrested on suspicion of criminal activities. A number of cases have already been referred to the Attorney General's Office for prosecution, he said. "Over the past two weeks, 234 individuals have been

arrested allegedly involved in criminal events, cases of some of them have been sent to the attorney general and the remaining will be sent soon," Rahimi said.

According to the Kabul police department, a total of 121 have been charged for crimes committed. Rahimi said that among those arrested were 37 suspicious beggars.
